ENGAGING PARTNERS AT QPSF



Nakilat held yet another successful Qatar Project Shipping Forum (QPSF) in London on 25th and 26th April 2016. Currently in its 19th cycle, the semi-annual forum was attended by Nakilat's charterers Qatargas and RasGas, along with other owners of LNG and LPG vessels and vessel operators such as STASCO.

QPSF is an initiative organized and hosted by Nakilat ever since its inception to foster a stronger relationship between the company and its partners, as well as establish an open communication channel for all parties. It is a platform where partners may address concerns regarding the operation of Nakilat's wholly and partially owned vessels in addition to holding insightful discussions on topics pertaining to safety, operations and regulatory updates. Industry experts were also invited to share best practices in areas such as crew management, training and advanced technologies.

SHARING INDUSTRY EXPERTISE

In light of advancements made in the areas of Information Technology (IT) and Human Resources (HR), Nakilat has been invited to share its expertise with industry peers at two strategic forums held in Doha – the SAP forum and annual Qatarization review meeting.

At the SAP forum, Nakilat IT Manager Hamad Rashid Suwaid participated as one of key panel members alongside other prominent industry players to discuss the company's successful corporate digital transformation, which has not only reaped significant cost-savings but also created business value for Nakilat's operations. Nakilat held its second Fleet Officers Meeting (FOM) in Poland from 19-20 April 2016. The event was particularly significant as it was the first time officers from both NQSL's LNG and LPG fleets were gathered together for a conference.

The event kick-started with a keynote address by Nakilat Fleet Director Samir Bailouni, followed by a series of insightful presentations including one by a guest speaker from Secure West, which focused on illegal immigration at sea – a crisis rampantly plaguing the shipping industry today.

The 2-day conference allowed representatives from NQSL, BSM (Isle of Man) and the fleet officers to interact and bond through working groups, and raise their concerns and provide feedback during the comprehensive and interactive Q&A session.

Nakilat's determination to enhance its employee welfare coupled with the event's success will see to a second installment of the FOM planned for September this year.

Qatar has traditionally been a country with a deep-rooted maritime history. Its reputation exponentially grew in recent years as the world's top exporter of liquefied natural gas (LNG), with Nakilat providing this essential transportation link to global markets. 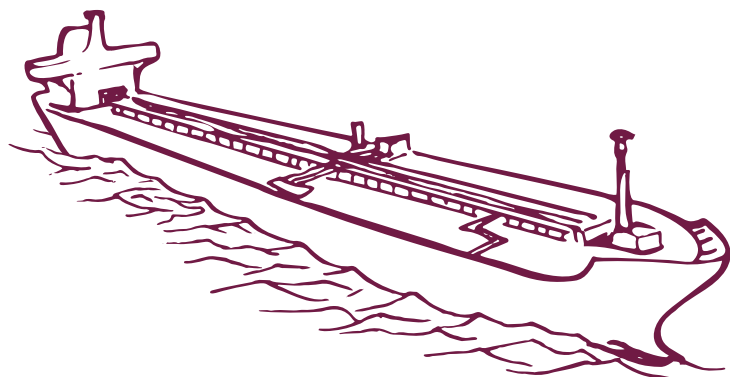


LNGC MOZAH LOADS MILESTONE CARGO AT RLC PORT



Nakilat's Q-Max LNG carrier Mozah was honoured as the 10,000th LNG carrier to load cargo at the Port of Ras Laffan on 8th May 2016. A ceremony was held by Qatar Petroleum at the Seafarer's Facility within the Port, with senior executives from Nakilat, Qatargas and RasGas in attendance. To commemorate the occasion, a plaque was presented to the vessel's Captain Neil Lovesy and Chief Engineer Beris Pfeifer during the ceremony.

NEW ADDITION TO AL SADD SKYLINE

Visitors to our new office premises will now be able to spot the brand new Nakilat logos from a mile away as it sits proudly at the top of Shoumoukh Tower B. One of the key objectives of the office relocation was to increase public awareness and visibility of Nakilat, and the newly installed logos play a big part in achieving that.

The two logos are visible from C-Ring Road (coming from Rayyan Road) and Al Sadd Street. At night, they are back-lit by LED lights to ensure low energy consumption while at the same time ensuring prominent visibility. These installations conclude a major chapter of the relocation project spearheaded by General Services.

Head of General Services Scott Jappy said, "On behalf of my team, we would like to extend our heartfelt appreciation to everyone for their co-operation and support that has led to the success of the office relocation project."

Successful collaboration

General Services and SHEQ department have successfully collaborated to achieve a 97% reduction of plastic waste (small water bottles), with an annual cost saving of USD\$35,000 through utilization of water dispensers and 5-gallon bottles in the new corporate office premises (Shoumoukh Tower).

INTERNATIONAL DELEGATIONS VISIT SHIPYARD



Nakilat has hosted visits by several international delegations to the Erhama Bin Jaber Al Jalahma Shipyard over the past few months, namely the Thailand Ministry of Labour, Chief of Naval staff from the Republic of Sudan and senior management from the South Hook LNG Terminal in UK. Such visits are essential to build up awareness on Nakilat's extensive business interests, as well as promote its shipyard facility and services to a wider international audience.



Initiated by the IMO (International Maritime Organization), Day of the Seafarer is held on 25 June annually to recognize the contributions of seafarers to society. This year's theme At Sea For All is in line with the 2016 World Maritime Day theme Shipping: Indispensable to the world, which emphasizes that seafarers serve at sea not just for the shipping industry or for their own career purposes but for society at large and, consequently, they are 'indispensable to the world'.

To commemorate this day, Nakilat's Marine Personnel Department (MPD) conducted several ship visits to 'spread the joy' to marine personnel onboard Nakilat vessels at the Port of Ras Laffan and also held a celebration for the seafarers, which included fun team activities at the Port's Seafarers Centre.

All in all, it was a memorable day for our seafarers and an excellent welfare initiative to show appreciation to our seagoing staff.

GREEN-CERTIFIED SHIPS

Nakilat firmly believes in operating in a responsibly manner, be it through its daily shipping or shipyard operations. It is a matter of pride for the company that a majority of our wholly-owned vessels are today certified for the Green Award, especially taking into consideration that we embarked on the certification process back in 2015.

Three of Nakilat's wholly-owned vessels, Al Hamla, Al Gattara and Al Gharaffa, have recently completed and passed their second annual survey for the Green Award without any non-compliances. This is a notable achievement as the rigorous awarding procedure involves an assessment that focuses on crew, operational, environmental and managerial elements.

The Green Award is administered by the Bureau Green Award, the executive body of the independent non-profit Green Award Foundation. It certifies that a vessel meets with high operating standards of safety and cleanliness, which not only benefits the environment but also, enables the operator (Nakilat) to realize financial savings.





EYE ON SAFETY

A safety stand-down focusing on eye injuries was recently conducted onboard all NSQL-managed vessels following reports and incidents of such occurrences. Crew members as well as sub-contractors were gathered for the session, during which details of these incidents were highlighted and a review held on the company's existing safety policies and procedures. The open discussion also allowed for identification of potential hazards and a review of protective measures in place, thereby effectively raising awareness and vigilance on the matter.

Such sessions are vital to ensure that all marine personnel are well informed on all safety measures and procedures in place so as to create a safe and injury-free working environment onboard vessels.



Our corporate vision clearly states Nakilat's desire to be an owner of vessels with high standards of safety, health, environment and quality. To enable this, SHEQ has implemented a scheme awareness and inculcate safety as part of daily life at sea. There are three elements to the scheme - a safety evening, a safety person of the month and a lucky dip draw.

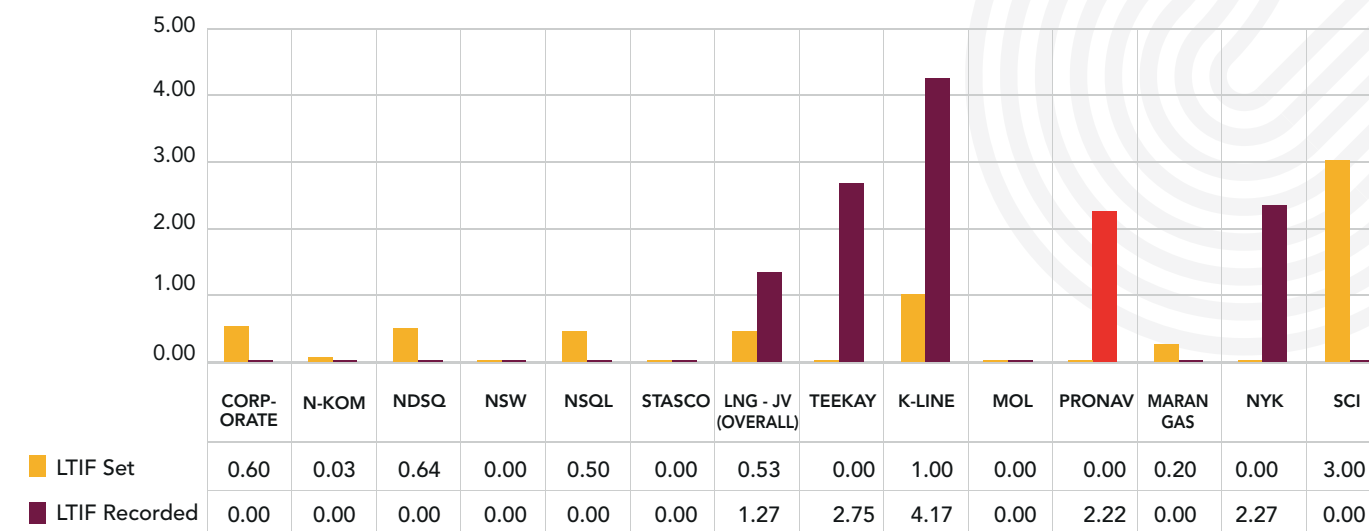
The Safety Evening is an informal monthly social gathering where all personnel are encouraged to attend and promote topical safety matters. The Safety Person of the Month is a seafarer whom has officially reported an unsafe condition through the 'Omnisafe' 512 Form procedure. A small selection of 512s are selected as the best entries for the month and the winner is determined by all the crew at the Safety Evening. The submission of a 512 form entitles the author to an entry in the lucky dip draw and the winner can select a gift from the NSQL corporate gifts catalogue.

Not only has this initiative has been well received by personnel onboard the vessels but also, it is a good opportunity for them to enjoy a fun-filled evening together thus promoting team-building and cohesion which are essential ingredients for a safe and successful voyage.



SAFETY STATISTICS (AS OF 1ST JUNE 2016)

Nakilat and its joint ventures upheld their good safety performance for the first six months of 2016, by remaining within the set KPI for Lost Time Incidents (LTI) which is measured as frequency rate of LTI. An LTI is defined as an injury that prevents an employee from carrying out his/her duties, or reporting for work the day following the injury.



N-KOM inks fleet agreement with Samos Steamship

N-KOM has signed a fleet agreement with Samos Steamship Company during one of the biggest shipping events of the year, Posidonia, held in Athens in June 2016. The Greek shipping company is an existing client of N-KOM, with several repairs completed for their fleet of tankers to date.

Under the fleet agreement, N-KOM will be the preferred shipyard in the Middle East for the repairs of all vessels owned by Samos Steamship Company.



Managing Director of Nakilat Eng. Abdullah Fadhalah Al Sulaiti said, "We are pleased to be strengthening our partnership with our client Samos Steamship through the signing of this fleet agreement. N-KOM has successfully tripled its clientele from Greece over the past year, especially for tanker and bulk carrier repairs. 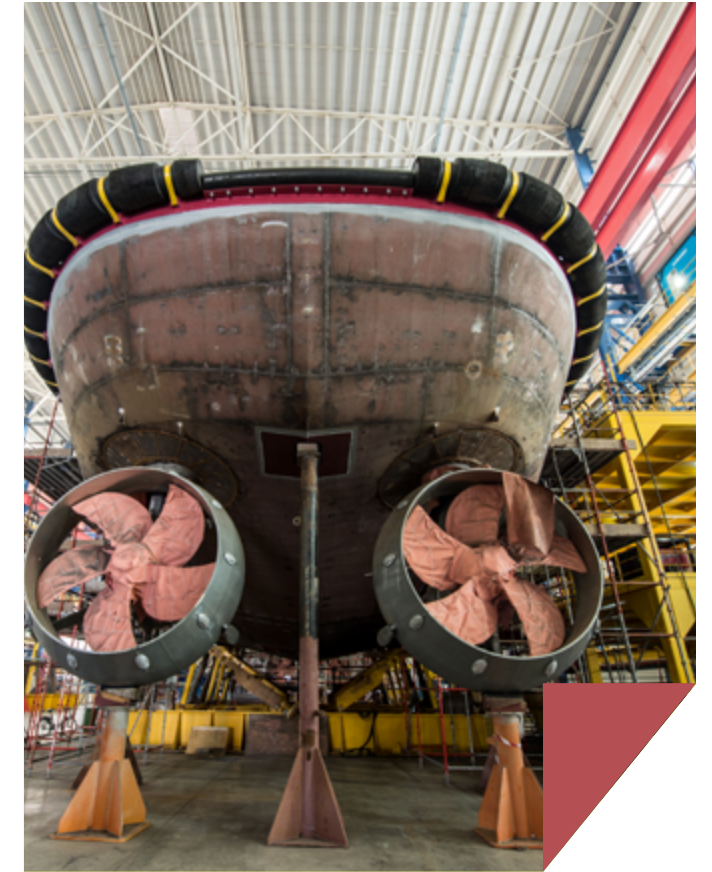
NDSQ ACHIEVES SAFETY MILESTONE



NDSQ has successfully crossed 10.3 million safe man-hours without any Lost Time Incident (LTI) since the start of operations in 2010. This is a remarkable achievement for a ship building yard, especially considering the extensive scale and complexity of operations at the 18-hectare facility.

The yard is currently on track to deliver vessels for the Hamad Port Project, with eight vessels currently under construction and three mooring vessels poised for delivery. Two fast diving vessels (FDVs) are presently in advanced stages of the construction process, with launching anticipated by end of this year and early next year.

Commenting on these achievements, NDSQ Managing Director Rino Brugge said, "Safety is a key element that underscores all our operations at NDSQ. This safety milestone achieved is a matter of great pride for the shipyard, considering that we have only been in operation for 5 years and have successfully delivered a number of newbuilding projects safely and on time, to support the maritime needs of the State of Qatar."



NAC extends agency services

7 April 2016 marked a milestone occasion for Nakilat Agency Company (NAC) as the agency handled its first vessel representation for a vessel at the new Hamad Port. With the addition of Hamad Port, NAC is now able to extend its services to a total of eight ports and terminals across Qatar, which is a marked achievement compared to the two ports - Ras Laffan and Mesaieed, that it used to originally serve. It is also noteworthy that NAC has maintained a perfect safety track record over its 11 years of operation, with an average of 4,300 port calls handled per annum.
